The Journey Continues...

It's November and we've finally come to the time when we can use our voices. There are two big votes during the first full week of November where our collective voices will be heard. The first vote is November 5th – the day American citizens cast their ballots for President and Vice President, US Senate, US Representative, along with several state offices. I don't think it is overly dramatic to describe the campaign this year as divisive, ugly, and downright annoying. I don't know about you, but I will be relieved when the candidates stop spending millions of dollars trying to convince me their opponent is the worst human being on the planet.

But as the traps of giving into the divisiveness are all around us, let us take a moment to remember who we are and whose we are. To help in this regard, I've included something found on the internet recently. It's called "The Christian Voter's Guide".

The Christian Voter's Guide By: Brian Zahnd

1. The political process, while necessary, has little to do with how God is saving the world.
2. The fate of the Kingdom of God does not depend on political contests.
3. Don't be naïve, political parties are more interested in Christian votes than they are in Christian values.
4. The bottom line for political parties is power. The bottom line for a Christian is love. And therein lies the rub.
5. While in pursuit of the Ring of Power, you are not permitted to abandon the Sermon on the Mount.
6. If your political passion makes it hard for you to love your neighbor as yourself, then you need to turn it down a notch.
7. Your task is to bring the salt of Christian civility to an ugly and acrimonious political process.
8. To dismember the body of Christ over politics is a grievous sin.
9. Exercise your liberty to vote your conscience and conviction, while accepting that other Christians will do the same and vote differently than you.
10. It's more important that your soul be filled with love than it is for your political team to win the game.

Isn't that an awesome list of reminders? I was planning to pick two or three things for us to keep in mind, but I think we should remember and apply *all* of them, no matter what side of the political divide we are on. Especially in those moments when we feel our blood boiling and our fears rising as we come down the homestretch of this election season.

And let us not forget, before we were old enough to claim a political party to belong to, we were named and claimed by God. No political party has done for us what God has done for us, nor is there a political party (or candidate) that has been

endorsed by God. I'm not saying there aren't good and bad candidates running for office. There are. Just remember that no candidate is the only one answer we need. The truth is, there has only been one person in history who is the only answer we need, and he ascended into heaven to sit at the right hand of God 40 days after he walked out of the tomb fully alive and resurrected.

Which brings us to the second election in November. While the campaigns and the candidates are determined to tear us apart by November 5th, on Saturday November 9th, there will be a vote for us to come together. On November 9th, delegates from across the state of Pennsylvania are going to cast their ballots and decide if the four UCC Conferences in Pennsylvania will come together to become one Keystone Conference. This vote is the culmination of two years of work by the Keystone Working Group. They have figured out how to staff and budget for the new Conference and they've figured out ways we can make this transition as seamless and positive as possible. For example, the Keystone Working Group wisely determined that if we are going to come together as one Conference, then we should have one mission focus to inspire us as we come together and work together.

To that end, the mission focus the Keystone Working Group has decided upon is "People of the Table." The state of Pennsylvania is a huge producer of food for our country and the world, yet we have an alarming number of people who are hungry. So, the mission focus of the 524 churches in the new Keystone Conference will be to keep our food banks stocked and our neighborhoods fed through community meals. If that sounds like something we are already doing at St. Mark's, you are right. Only now, we are going to have over 500 congregations joining us in our efforts so that people all across the state have adequate food on their tables.

You see, this is what can happen when we come together and work together as brothers and sisters in Christ. There will continue to be other social justice issues that we'll pursue in the state of Pennsylvania, such as ending gun violence and homelessness. Those issues need addressed as well. But since the Communion Table is at the center of our faith and understanding of salvation, the Communion Table can inspire us to be "People of the Table" so that every table in the state has food that will nourish those in need. After all, in the 25th chapter of Matthew, Jesus challenges us by saying, "Whatever you do for the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me."

While the political campaigns and candidates continue to tear us apart, keep in mind that there are people out there working long hours finding ways for us to come together. I don't know about you, but I'm weary of all the negativity in our world today. I think we need to readjust our attention to the Light, Love and Truth of our Savior, don't you? And when the candidates wonder why we aren't listening to their messages anymore, they'll have to see what we are so busy doing in our work as brothers and sisters in Christ. Maybe then they will learn the message that will truly transform lives.

REPORT OF CONSISTORY – OCTOBER 2024

Pastor Jones and his wife, MJ, will host dinners on Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Easter Sunday (2025) for those members who do not have local family or other plans. The meals will be held in Fellowship Hall with times to be announced. The Mission Team will be accepting monetary donations through November 10, 2024, to purchase items needed for the victims of Hurricane Helene and Hurricane Milton. The items will be transported to NC for distribution in mid-November. The Mission Team was approved for their trip in 2025. They will work with WARM in Wilmington, NC. The Good Samaritan committee will provide names and holiday gift ideas for both the children at the AGAPE House and residents of the Cedar Haven nursing facility. Both will be available in mid-November. A substitute organist has been hired to help with the services two Sundays a month. She will work out a schedule with Kathy Follett to coordinate the Sundays. Kathy will remain the accompanist for the choirs. The per diem organist rate was set at \$125. Pastor Jones received his annual performance review with the Spiritual Council. The annual congregational meeting was set for January 26, 2025.

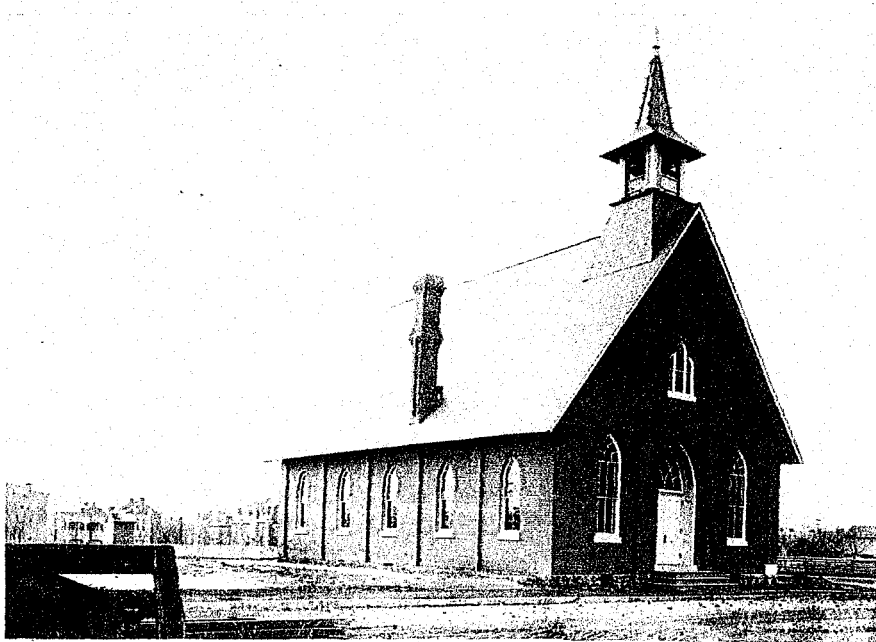
Operation Helene – we are gathering monies to help those impacted by Helene in the North Carolina area. While Little Chapel has stopped their gathering of items for Asheville, we are working to find a group that will be willing to accept our donations. The last day for financial donations is currently slated to be November 10th.

St. Mark's Chapel

St. Mark's Chapel was erected during the summer and fall of 1885. The cornerstone was laid July 19 during the sweltering heat of the afternoon. Rev. Kremer of Tabor gave the German address and Rev. Resser of St. John's, the English message. The Rev. A. R. Bartholomew of Pottsville also spoke to the gathering. During the ceremony members of the mission marched past the stone, which was a gift of the Adult Class, and deposited the items to be preserved: a Bible, a Heidelberg Catechism, our constitution, a brief history of the mission, names of the officers, newspapers of the day, and various other items.

The Chapel, 42 by 72 feet, contained an auditorium, 39 by 52 feet, a primary room, 16 by 18 feet, and a Bible classroom of about the same size. When the steeple was completed, Tabor gave the mission one of its small bells which was hung October 31. The bell, dated 1796, was cast in England by Thomas Herrs. It remains the oldest piece of our history which is still with us.

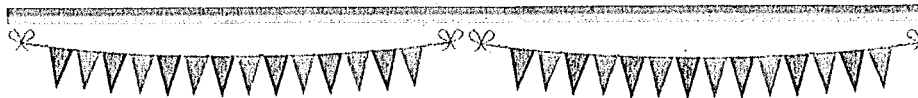
The big day came on December 13 when both the members of Tabor and the members of the young mission met in the U.B. Aid Building and marched through the streets to this site. They marched "but not with banners flying but with uplifted umbrellas, by 10's and by 100's, amid a driving rainstorm through snow and slush and



water ankle deep." Rev. Kremer and Rev. Resser preached the dedication sermons along with T. S. Johnston and the Rev. W. C. Schaeffer, President of Palatinate College in Myerstown. Services were held in the morning, afternoon, and evening with a large attendance at each in spite of the weather.

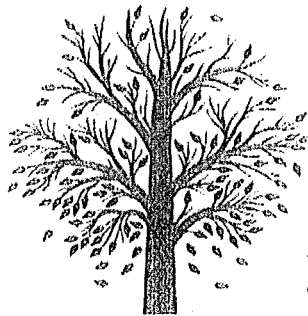

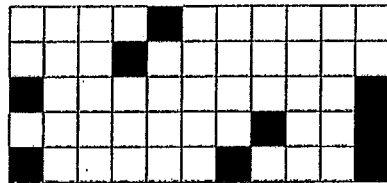

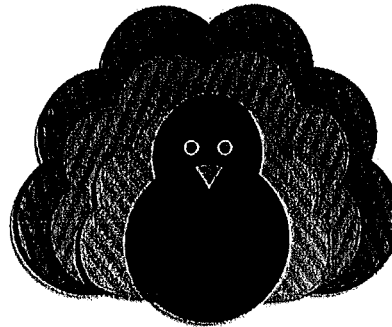

GLAZED PECANS

Ingredients:

- 1 c. sugar
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 2 egg whites

- 1 lb. pecan halves
- 1/4 lb. butter

Directions:

Beat egg whites till stiff; add sugar slowly. Add pecans and mix. Melt butter in 9x13 inch baking pan or dish. Add pecan mixture; spread. Bake for 30 minutes at 325 degrees, turning every 10 minutes. Remove from oven, place on brown paper bag; spread and cool.

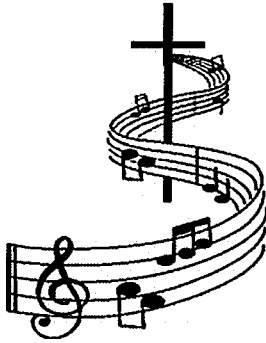

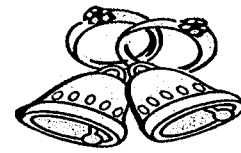

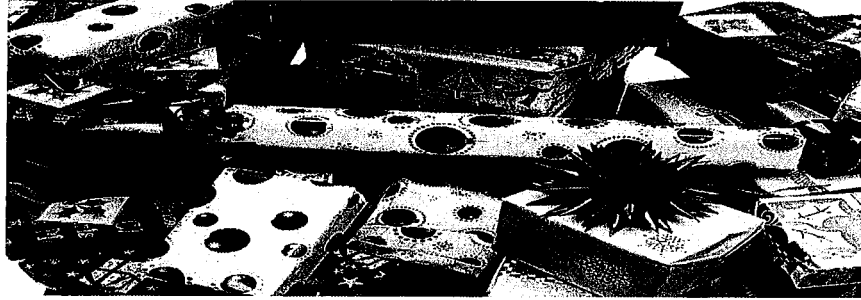
