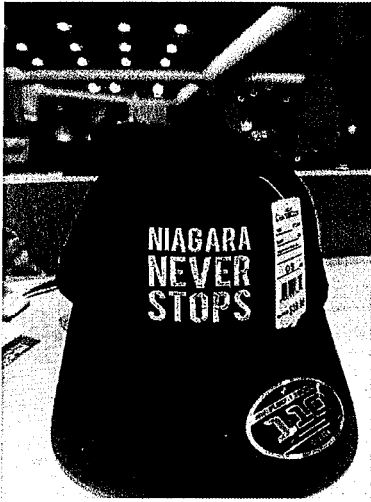

The Journey Continues...



While on vacation recently, MJ and I had to opportunity to visit the Canadian side of Niagara Falls. I've been to Niagara Falls several times before, but this was the first time MJ had seen the Falls in person. I think Niagara Falls is an amazing place to visit, and due to the Falls being declared one of the Eight Natural Wonders of the World, the Falls attracts a wide diversity of races, cultures, languages, and religions from all over the world. Now something that I think is fascinating – with the volume of people who visit and the vast diversity of people – everyone was respectful, cooperative, and peaceful. I have never experienced anyone visiting the Falls who was unruly or disrespectful and we never saw extra police officers trying to keep misbehaving people in line. I don't know, maybe it is easier to look beyond our differences because so much of our attention is centered on the beauty and power of the Falls?

It has been close to 25 years since my last visit to Niagara Falls, but it didn't take long for the memories of awe and wonder at the beauty and power of the Falls to come flooding back. To see Niagara Falls is one thing, but to hear the roar of the water as it cascades over horseshoe falls is incredible. Since this was MJ's first visit to Niagara Falls, we did many "touristy" things, like the boat ride on the Maid of the Mist and the Journey Behind the Falls. We also took advantage of some newer attractions like the Butterfly Conservatory and a tour of the Power Station at Night. The Power Station at Night was one of my favorite things, besides spending time at the Falls themselves.

As our time at Niagara was ending, and we were spending our last few moments watching the Falls, I felt a sense of sadness. I love visiting Niagara Falls, and I was going to miss losing myself in thought as I watched (and heard) that water tumbling down. But then I remembered a phrase I saw on a T-Shirt and ball cap in the gift shop at Table Rock Center. The phrase simply said, "Niagara Never Stops" (There is a picture of the ball cap at the top of this article). Even though I cannot see or hear the Falls from central PA, I know the water is still roaring away, the mist is still flying, and the beauty of that special place is still inspiring all those who are able to visit. Niagara never stops, and the peaceful feelings that place brings are carried with me today.

As we were driving from Niagara Falls to Pittsburgh, I began to think a little deeper about Niagara Falls. I wondered what God was thinking when God created Niagara Falls? I wondered if God knew how we would be inspired by spending time watching and hearing the roaring water? I wondered what God thinks of the daredevils who try to conquer the Falls in a barrel? And then I start to think even deeper...as amazing and mesmerizing as places like Niagara Falls and the Grand Canyon are, the God who created them is even more amazing and mesmerizing. So if Niagara never stops, and God created Niagara Falls, then how much stronger, and more powerful, and inspiring, and unstoppable is God? And with the love and presence of God a part of our lives, if our primary focus was on God, and our personal opinions and agendas came second, I wonder if the world around us could become a place of respect, cooperation, and peace? One thing is for sure, I know it can't hurt to try. So who is with me?

Report of the Consistory - September 2024

Two new banners were purchased for the Sanctuary - one by the Bible Study group in memory of Margaret "Peg" Clark and the second by Rebecca Colban in memory of her husband, Peter Colban. The Christian Education committee will be hosting training sessions for all members who assist with kids and youth - both teaching and activities. The topic will be bullying and how to prevent it. The Evangelism and Mission committee will be in front of the church at 8th and Monument Streets on Trick or Treat night to give candy to the neighborhood children. The committee will also host a community spaghetti dinner on November 2, 2024. On the first and third Saturdays in January, February and March, the committee will host "Puzzle Mornings" as a fellowship opportunity. There will be puzzles for all ages from students to adults. Sales of Texas Roadhouse gift cards will be held October 27, 2024, through November 10, 2024. The first stage of organ repairs has been completed. The second stage is being planned for summer of 2025. Two property issues were approved. The first is for cleaning of the Fellowship Hall and kitchen floors plus the hallways outside those rooms. The work room off the office will be added if the cost will not exceed an additional \$500. The second is to repair the emergency generator. It is currently not working and cannot provide any support in the event of a power outage. The Personnel committee has conducted some of the staff reviews and will complete the remaining staff by the next meeting. Pastor Jones will have his review at the October Spiritual Council meeting.

Plans for a Permanent Home

Even before St. Mark's opened, plans were made to erect a chapel for the new mission school. A committee explored the northwest corner of Eighth and Lehman Streets and the southwest corner of Seventh and Mifflin where the new housing project is now located. Finally this present site, 100 by 156 feet, was chosen and purchased from Adolphus and Elizabeth Reinoehl and Charles and Sarah Meily for the substantial sum of \$3000. This location had previously been part of the Reinoehl and Meily Lumber Yard which stretched along the canal to the north. It had also served as a Civil War camp for the 93rd Regiment upon its formation. Monument Park to our south was the officers' quarters of the camp.

Financial support for the chapel came from several sources. Tabor collected \$979.25, and a canvass for subscriptions of the north side of town in March 1885, yielded another \$2,176.25. This canvass was never fully completed and not considered very successful. A drive that summer for "brick money" added \$440 for the construction.

An interesting source of support came from Mr. Joseph Bowman, an elder of Tabor. He had been interested in seeing the Reformed movement spread to the southern part of the country and to the northern section of town, and so in his last will and testament, he gave a house and a lot on South Tenth Street for the founding of St. Paul's, Quentin, and the dwelling next to it was conveyed for the purpose of founding this church. The house was sold in December 1885 for \$642 which was applied to the purchase of the lot.

By 1887 St. Mark's Mission School had built its chapel and reduced its debt to \$4,462.

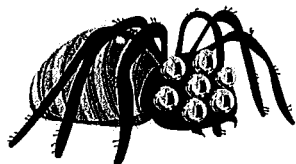
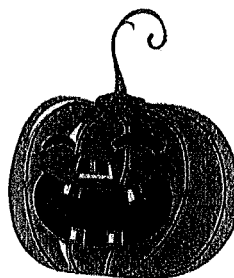
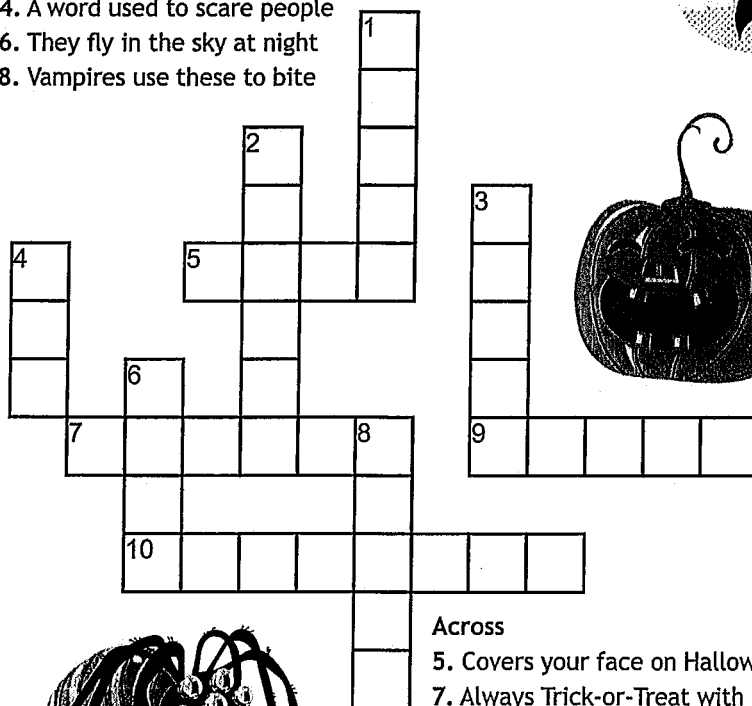

LEMON BARS

2 cups flour
1 ½ sticks butter
½ cup 10X sugar
4 eggs
Pinch of salt

2 cups granulated sugar
6 Tbsp. lemon juice
4 Tbsp. flour
1 tsp. baking soda

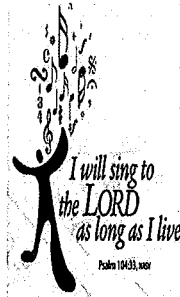
Mix the first 3 ingredients well and press into greased 9x13 inch pan. Bake for 20 minutes at 350 degrees. Mix lightly the eggs, salt and sugar. Fold in flour, baking powder, lemon juice. Pour over baked crust and bake for 25 minutes longer at 350 degrees. Remove from oven and sprinkle with 10x sugar. Cool and cut into bars.

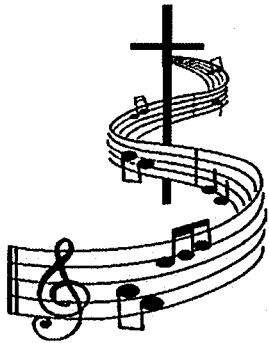

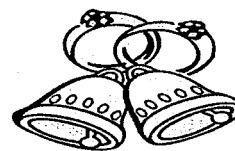
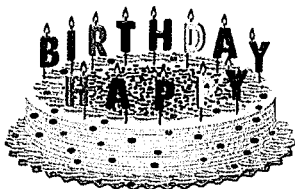
An Update from your Music Ministry Coordinator:



I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your prayers, cards, and emails as I continue my leave of absence to recoup and recover from my illness. I appreciate the continued kindness, grace, and support shown by the church, congregation, Personnel Committee and Consistory and thank Ken, Peg, Heidi, Kathy, Tim, and Cindy for stepping in as needed.

I'm also thankful for the accommodations that have been made so I can continue to contribute to the music ministry. I miss making music with my church family and attending church. Unfortunately the Paxil did not work for me so I weaned off that for sort of cleanse. My dry heaving/retching spells have gotten worse incapacitating me and making me homebound. The psychiatrist is going to have me try taking brand name Effexor again which was the medication I was on when this whole ordeal started however in the generic form. My PCP has referred me to endocrinology to see if my hormones are in check but that appointment is not until the end of October. It's very challenging to push through severe anxiety/ocd as it likes to push back and keep me from doing things. Anxiety/ocd creates physiological symptoms that can be debilitating and difficult to overlook in this case the dry heaving. My therapists are trying to help me with this but it is difficult and stressful. Therapy is frustrating and futile when the body and soul are too sick to effectively do what the therapist wants me to do to face the anxiety as it only induces anxiety. Unfortunately medication can only do so much but it would be nice if I could find something that provided better relief. I am super sensitive to any sensation I feel in my body. I have to figure out how to overcome that and live through and lean into the distress which is really hard to do. Your continued prayers for good days and complete healing are appreciated as my recovery continues.
