promise that death is temporary and life is eternal.

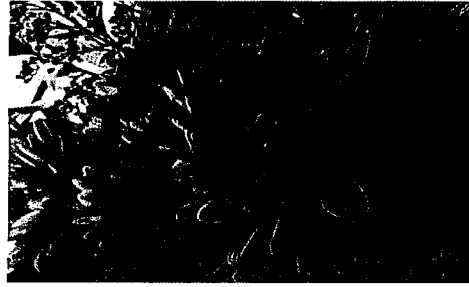

The Journey Continues...

To say this year's Mission Trip to Wilmington, NC was unique would be an understatement. Last year, we were keeping a close eye on Tropical Storm Debbie. This year, we didn't have a Tropical Storm to occupy our thoughts, but we still had some unexpected twists and turns. The trip started well, and everything was going as planned. We didn't run into heavy traffic or inclement weather, so the journey to Wilmington was uneventful. We had a small snafu with the pizza we ordered for dinner Saturday evening, but that was our only challenge. The twists and turns arrived Sunday morning as we were getting ready to leave for the worship service on the beach.

I came out to the front porch to join the others when Kathy advised me they needed to take a trip to the Emergency Room. Oh no. When I asked what happened, she pointed to Vickie who looked pale and struggled to stand even with assistance. So, Kathy and Al took Vickie to a nearby Emergency Room, while the rest of us made our way to the worship service. As we walked through the sand to choose a place to sit down, we were stunned and somber. We worried about Vickie, and for me, it felt weird to be on the beach with 1/3 of our group unable to be with us.

As we waited for the service to begin, I absorbed the sights and sounds around us. It was extra windy by the ocean, so I had to hold onto my bulletin a little tighter. The sunrise was very bright, too, so I was thankful my hat shaded my eyes from the sunlight. On one side of the "sanctuary" was an unmanned lifeguard tower. At the front of the congregation were two metal posts supporting a blue and white surfboard that served as an Altar. On the Altar was a cross, along with a basket of bread and a chalice for Sacrament of Holy Communion. Scattered around the beach were young children playing in the sand and surf. There were people jogging and walking along the shoreline along with people swimming in the ocean and riding waves on boogie boards. This was not a typical worship experience, but still, it was a very sacred space.

As we absorbed the sights and sounds around us, I felt the peace of being in the presence of God. Even though I wondered (and worried) what was going on with Vickie at the hospital – and there were lots of distractions from the children playing and the people moving up and down the shoreline – the presence of God in that space was stronger than the distractions around me. In that moment, I had complete faith that everything was going to be all right. I didn't know how, but I didn't feel the need to worry about it either. It was in God's hands and it was going to be OK.

I am so thankful for moments when God's presence is undeniable. The presence of God almost always shows up in unexpected places, and once we sense it, the feeling is impossible to forget. The experience we had on the beach reminds me of a quote from contemporary theologian Richard Rohr who said, "We cannot attain the presence of God. We're already totally in the presence of God. What's absent is awareness."

Isn't that a comforting thought? We are already in the presence of God, and the only thing absent is our awareness. No matter how stunning a situation may be, or how many distractions try to grab our attention, God is always there. If being in the presence of God doesn't give a sense of peace in the midst of the storms of life, then I don't know what will. I hope and pray we all have the opportunity to experience the presence of God in undeniable and unforgettable ways, especially when life becomes overwhelming. Because God is with us in unexpected and challenging places, and God is bigger than the distractions and worries that consume our thoughts. Thanks be to God.

Beginning September 1, St. Marks will be renting two rooms in the Christian Education building to WB Music Therapy. They are a group of 5 trained and licensed music therapists that provide therapy for people of all ages who are dealing with things like Autism, Post Traumatic Stress, and physical disabilities such as Parkinson's disease. They have been renting from Salem Lutheran for a number of years but have outgrown the space that Salem has available for them. They will be using the parlor/library and pre-school Sunday school rooms. The books, bookshelves, bells, chimes, music stands, and grandfather clock that were in the parlor have been moved to the primary Sunday school room at the north end of the hall. That room will become the new library and music room. The items and materials used for children's church (that was previously held in the pre-school Sunday school room) have been moved into the nursery and that room will now be used for all of the youth that attend children's church. A big Thank You goes out to Meredith Myers and Marilyn Reppert for their flexibility and help in getting the nursery arranged to handle all the youth that attend children's church.

You may also have noticed that the large parking lot on Mifflin St. and the smaller lot next to the church have been recently re-sealed and the lines repainted. This job was approved at a recent consistory meeting with the money coming from the memorial fund.

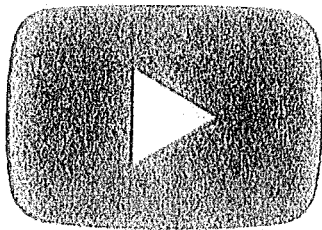
Finally, the roof replacement project should begin sometime in September or the first week in October. Thanks to all who have contributed and contribute to the roof fund.

Report of the Consistory - August 2025

The second phase of the repairs to the organ have been started. The organ should be able to be used again in early September. The increased use of the building due to the rentals to the day care and the Spanish congregation have shown higher bills for electric service. This will continue to be monitored as the third rental to the music therapy program begins in September. The day care has asked to remain in the building and renew their lease. It was determined to continue their lease until the end of calendar year 2025 as soon as they provide updated liability insurance information, license to operate and their security and abuse clearances. The Spanish congregation needs to provide proof of the renewal of their liability insurance prior to September 1, 2025. The remainder of the funds brought over from St. John's will be used to cover the costs of sealing and painting the lines in the parking lots. The roof project will begin in late September. The Spanish congregation was granted permission to use the sanctuary on New Year's Eve from 10:00 pm to 12:30 am on New Year's Day.

Child Abuse Required Training

Another year has passed and it's time for that infamous Child Abuse Required Training. While it is something required by the insurance company, last year's bullying training showed us how much society has changed just in the last few years, thus making it more necessary for us to make sure we keep on our toes on protecting our young people. After reviewing many options of how to do the training, the Christian Ed committee is inviting all those that have active background checks to join us at this year's training class.

On Sundays September 21st and October 12th, we will be sharing the class on "Keeping Your Church Safe". You only need to attend ONE of the Sundays. The class will be after church in Fellowship Hall. Pizza will be provided for all participants. There will be a sign-up sheet in the narthex.

If you have taken training through another path (i.e. school, hospital, etc), then you just need to share that certificate, so we know you are exempt from needing to attend the training that we are providing. In addition to the video, there are discussion items for us to review.

"Kids Kamp 2025"

"True North: Trusting Jesus in a wild world" was the theme used to celebrate the **35th Anniversary of Kids Kamp!** And what a celebratory week it was! With an attendance of 37 children, we were reminded with Monday's rain storm why we need to maintain a capacity of 40 for safety of all at Pine Acres. It becomes quite crowded under the pavilion.

This year's memory verse was from Psalm 32:8, "The Lord says, "I will make you wise. I will show you where to go. I will guide you and watch over you." The children did a great job reciting our verse by Thursday morning's opening worship.

Daily opening worship offering totaled over \$370.00. To continue our outreach ministry, school supplies were again purchased and given to United Way project, "Stuff the Bus" to benefit the children of Lebanon County.

Music is a driving force when selecting our KK theme. With the aid of technology, the children learn choreography to the songs which they demonstrated during our Facebook presentation on Thursday. I would say this year's favorite song was "Power Shuffle".

Science projects and activities reinforced the theme as well, as Kampers learned about polarity with the use of a compass. It was a great way to relate with the children how we can use God as our compass to keep us on track.

The Pastor Gets a Study

St. Mark's Observer, September and October 1898:

"While away on his vacation, the pastor concluded that it would be no mistake to build up that vacant space that was lying between the church (Chapel) and the parsonage and have him utilize it as a study. So upon his return he asked the Sunday School and the Mite Society whether they would not conjointly erect the same. In view of this \$150 was voted for this purpose and at a congregational meeting held September 11 (1898), unanimous permission was granted to build the same. At the time some questioned whether this was an adequate amount. Since the room is completed it is found that those that questioned as to whether the amount was sufficient were evidently correct in their anticipations. In view of this it will be necessary for us to ask that this sum be augmented to the extent that it may reach to cover the whole expenditure. We feel that this will be done. In the construction of this new study, the idea of neatness over against the idea of show was taken into consideration. The result is that it is a room second to none in the Reformed Church. Communicating as it does with the parsonage and the church (Chapel) it makes it all the more pleasant. The Paster (Fisher) hereby tenders his sincere thanks to the kind donors of the funds for the construction of this attractive and cheerful room. We extend a most hearty invitation to all the members to come and visit us in our new home. Don't be backward. Come, you are all welcome."

The total construction cost for the project was \$214.35.

Mrs. Eliza Christine Goodman

Mrs. Goodman was born in Jonestown in 1825. Her father, George Mark, became the High Sheriff of Lebanon County in 1835, and at that time the family moved to Lebanon. Later she married Charles C. Goodman and resided at 440 N. Ninth Street.

Her Christian work began in Tabor Reformed Church, but her interest shifted quickly when the Northern Mission School was opened in 1885. Here Mrs. Goodman was elected the first Female Assistant Superintendent of St. Mark's.

In this role she worked tirelessly. There were very few homes in the congregation which she had not been in over the years looking after the interests of the children and thus quietly reaching out after the parents. She had no children of her own although in a sense she had children by the scores. Through her guidance and personal example, many were lead into a fuller spiritual life.


Eliza Goodman was also aware of the practical aspects of a growing church. She along with several other women continued the campaign for financial pledges to support the Chapel in 1885. Her "mission box" also provided funds when the school was in need; so too did her "dusting bag money".

When this Christian leader passed away in 1899, just 6 weeks after her brother, Cyrus K. Mark, she added \$500 to the \$5,000 bequest of her brother thus opening the way for the construction of our present sanctuary.

APPLE CRISP

Ingredients:

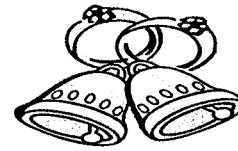
- 1 c. flour

- ½ tsp. salt

- 1 egg (unbeaten)
- 5 or 6 large apples
- 1/3 c. melted butter
- 1 tsp. cinnamon

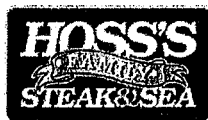

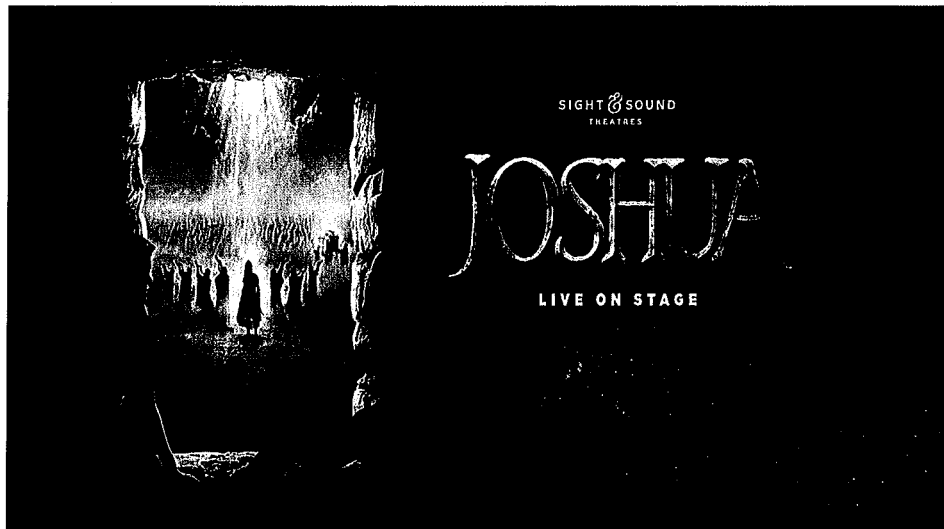
